BEFORE 10AM, AFTER 5PM (SUMMER) OR 4PM (WINTER)

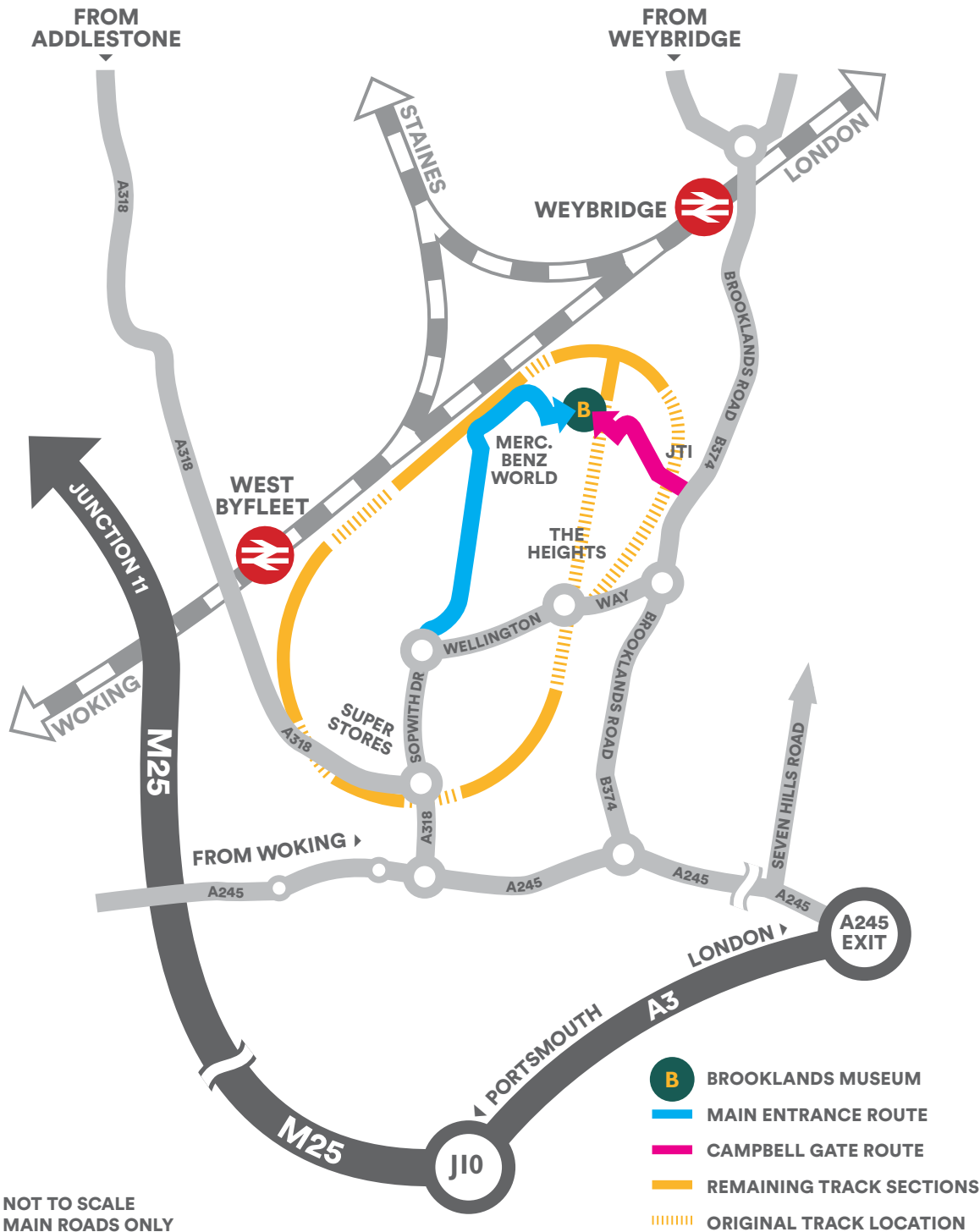
